



# **WE ACKNOWLEDGE...**

We gather on the traditional lands of the Anishinaabek (Uh-nish-in-ah-bek), Haudenosaunee (Ho-den-no-show-nee), Lunaapéewak (Len-ah-pay-wuk) and Attawandaron (Add-a-won-darun).

We acknowledge all the treaties that are specific to this area: the Two Row Wampum Belt Treaty of the Haudenosaunee Confederacy/Silver Covenant Chain; the Beaver Hunting Grounds of the Haudenosaunee NANFAN Treaty of 1701; the McKee Treaty of 1790, the London Township Treaty of 1796, the Huron Tract Treaty of 1827, with the Anishinaabeg, and the Dish with One Spoon Covenant Wampum of the Anishnaabek and Haudenosaunee.

This land continues to be home to diverse Indigenous peoples (First Nations, Métis and Inuit) whom we recognize as contemporary stewards of the land and vital contributors to society. We hold all that is in the natural world in our highest esteem and give honor to the wonderment of all things within Creation. We bring our minds together as one to share good words, thoughts, feelings and sincerely send them out to each other and to all parts of creation. We are grateful for the natural gifts in our world, and we encourage everyone to be faithful to the natural laws of Creation.

The three Indigenous Nations that are neighbours to London are the Chippewas of the Thames First Nation; Oneida Nation of the Thames; and the Munsee-Delaware Nation who all continue to live as sovereign Nations with individual and unique languages, cultures and customs.

This Land Acknowledgement is a first step towards reconciliation. It is the work of all citizens to step towards decolonizing practices and bringing our awareness into action. We encourage everyone to be informed about the traditional lands, Treaties, history, and cultures of the Indigenous people local to their region.

# **MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO AND BOARD CHAIR**

Dear Community,

2022 was the start of our industry recovery. RBC Place London reopened in March 2022 with our reduced team in full recovery mode! We hosted a total of 126 events in 2022, just under 50% of a pre-covid year. September to December was hopping with conferences, business events, galas, and festive parties, all back in full swing.

With 126 events, RBC Place London achieved 72% of 2019's total revenue and generated \$11.2 million in economic recovery. RBC Place London experienced a reduced operational loss from the previous two years, with significant positive growth in future events booked, glowing reviews on the food quality and service experiences from event organizers and high marks from our team on their RBC Place London team experience.

RBC Place London was very fortunate and appreciative to receive two federal grants; one under the Tourism Relief Recovery program, and the other from the Canada Community Revitalization Fund. The first grant supported technology enhancements including enhanced WIFI6 throughout, new digital sign on York Street, upgraded building automation system, and 3D event design software. The second is currently supporting the redevelopment of the King Street parkette on the north side of RBC Place London scheduled to be completed in June 2023.



RBC Place London was busy hosting events, driving economic recovery, and adding vibrancy to downtown London. RBC Place London was busy improving our team's ability to communicate with event organizers and our community, and enhancing the on-site guest experience.

Our organization has many to thank for supporting our recovery. Most importantly thank you to Council and the City of London administrative team for recognizing the importance of business events for London. Thank you to our Board of Directors, for their commitment of time, sharing of wisdom, and setting a strategic direction supporting recovery and growth. Thank you to our partners and clients, who trusted us once again. And finally thank you to our community for your ongoing trust and excitement about gathering again! RBC Place London looks forward to hosting your next event whether for business or leisure, our goal is to be your venue of choice!

## FEDDEV INVESTMENT PROJECTS

In Fall 2022, RBC Place London began renovating and revitalizing our King Street Parkette. It will be completed and ready to host events, or simply add to the downtown enjoyment for all whether staying, playing or living in the core by Summer 2023.

The new space will be fully-equipped with electrical, audio, and WIFI connections, customizable and coloured LED lighting to support our events.

The King Street Parkette Revitalization project is funded in part by the Government of Canada through the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario and is one of 10 community infrastructure and tourism projects across London that received funding under the Canada Community Revitalization Fund (CCRF) and Tourism Relief Fund (TRF).







## **PROGRESS REPORT**

Funding from FedDev Ontario's Tourism Relief Fund and the Government of Canada also allowed us to:

- Replace marquee digital sign with LED sign and cloud-based programming
- Upgrade guest WIFI system to most current WIFI6 standard with next generation firewall updated core switching
- Introduce 3D Floorplan program for improved client planning experience

#### **WORKING TOWARDS SUSTAINABILITY**

RBC Place London is committed to protecting our environment and is continuously looking to improve our waste management and energy programs. Our team is aiming to reduce and divert waste and identify other eco-friendly opportunities. We work towards sustainability by:

- Measuring our carbon footprint and finding opportunities to reduce our emissions year-overyear; RBC Place London has a goal to reduce energy usage by 30%, which began with a retrofit of the HVAC system, installing demand control ventilation units on 8 air handlers and resulting in a 10.7% energy savings
- Developing an improved sustainable purchasing policy
- Engaging our guests in a sustainable experience by offering:
  - Menus featuring Gluten-Free, and plant-based options
  - Take-out containers and utensils made of recyclable and compostable eco-friendly materials
  - Support to local responsible vendors and local/organic farms
  - To donate leftover meals to local charities
  - To divert food scraps from the regular waste stream to compost
  - Serving over 50% of individual portions in reusable containers
  - A fully functional recycling program which includes plastics, glass, aluminum, tin, paper and cardboard
  - Motion sensors on taps and toilets in public washrooms
  - Charging stations for electric vehicles in the underground parking lot
  - Underground secured bicycle racks for green transportation alternatives
  - A No-Idle zone in the front of the building
- Being a responsible and inclusive destination for our associates/guests by:
  - Encouraging ideas to expand our growth in all initiatives
  - Coordination of green or community service team-building ag
- An operational commitment to:
  - Maintain an effective kitchen grease recycling program
  - Complete lighting retrofit throughout the building to LED
  - Continue to reduce chemicals, purchasing eco-friendly housekeeping products



#### RBC PLACE LONDON GIVES BACK

In 2022, our team members collected over 400 lbs of canned goods, \$500 dollars in cash donations and almost 100 pairs of socks for the Business Cares Food Drive and 519Pledge for Socks. Our team also participated in London's Clean & Green 20-minute makeover and picked up garbage from all around our building.
